December 2021 Notes from the Sky Pilot's Page

Prepare the Way of the Lord! Advent – *Parousia* - experiencing the preparation for the coming of the Christ child while knowing that God is already present in our lives. Our Advent services this year will be based on a short essay, "Seeing the Light" by Robert Finch, from This Sacred Earth: Religion, Nature, Environment, 2nd Edition.

Our Advent worship services will look at our faith through a different angle of the light. We will be looking at our faith through the angles of hope, peace, joy and love through the elements of fire, earth, water and air. Finch's experience of the two differing views of light answered my question of how to do this. He shares that while on an evening walk in the late fall,

"I walk directly into the lowering sun, so that my vision of things is occluded, fragmented, blinded, and double-sunned by reflections in the water. It is like walking through a visual bramble, or maze, with my hand held in front of my eyes for protection. All is back-lit and glaring, so that I can get no hold on the landscape."

He is then coming back along the walk with the light at a different angle, and he experiences the landscape as, "some kind of revelation, like an idealized form. But of what?" For him some "profound illusion" had taken place, simply by changing the angle of the light.

The emotion here is of things suddenly and unexpectedly opening up. This is the sense that I hope to capture in Advent this year. A sense of looking at things through a different angle of light, by creating a completely different angle of light in worship.


We will be using a new version of an old Advent song – O Come O Come Emmanuel, written for the United Church of Canada, O Come, Advent, lyrics and arrangement by Adrian Marchuk. We will be opening with darkness, bringing in the light, inviting you to worship at the table by breaking the bread, joining in song and prayer and then closing with the cup of blessing. We will come to an understanding of *Parousia* – presence – preparing for an already present God, by connecting our experience through the elements of nature.

By exploring through nature, the elements will be seen and experienced not as symbolism but rather as the very building blocks of our identity. Finch's observation that "We are directly dependent on nature for the raw materials of our inner lives," allowing ourselves to better understand, as Finch says, that "...our souls may be created both individually and as a species by what we experience through our senses. If this is so, then when a society increasingly lives without direct access to natural experience, does it run the risk of literally becoming soulless?"


Using the gifts of our resident fabric artists Marie Shirley-Jones and Grazia Giacomelli, we will be the recipients of a very different design of our worship space using different angles of light to lead the liturgy of bringing in the Advent light that will unveil the experience of *Parousia...* an already present God. Along with decorating our Sanctuary for the Advent and Christmas seasons, we can look back a century ago to when the Sanctuary was also being decorated for the season. For this month's Shalom, we're looking again at the December of

1923 photo of Sanctuary. The decoration was both for advent and the formal dedication of the building as a Methodist Episcopal Church after six months of use and work. The dedication was a three day event held on December 15, 16 and 17 of 1923. The plans were reported a week in advance in The Red Lodge Pickett Journal newspaper edition of December 8, 1923 as follows:



"Dedication of the new Methodist Episcopal church the coming weekend will be the occasion for an elaborate program according to announcement made by Rev. F. C. Fulford [pastor of the Red Lodge Church.]. Bishop Charles Wesley Burns of the Helena area will deliver the principal dedicatory address Sunday morning. Rev. E. C. Bartlett of Anaconda, Rev. Charles E. Cunningham of Townsend, Rev. Fred . Whitford of Forsyth, all former pastors of this. church, will be present for the dedication exercises. The Midland Ministerial Association will meet here Monday morning. The services will begin with a public banquet at the church basement Saturday at six o'clock. At eight there will be public services in the church. Rev R. C. Ten Broeck, rector of the Episcopal church, will ask the invocation; Rev. G. W. Churchill of the Congregational church will give the scripture reading. Chas. H. Draper, will extend the address of welcome as president of the Red Lodge-Montana club; Bishop Burns will respond. There will be an address by H. L. Hussong, principal of the high school, and by R. M. Porter, principal of the city schools. There will be special music by Lloyd Long, by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Logan and by the Misses Beatrice and Minnie Fulford.

"Sunday there will be morning worship at ten forty-five. Rev. E. C. Bartlett will read the invocation, Rev. Fred Whitford will give the scripture lesson. Rev. ·R. C. Edington, superintendent of the Yellowstone District, will read a financial report. Bishop Burns will deliver the dedicatory address. There will be special musical numbers by the choir and by Miss Harriet Herrman.

"The [Sunday] evening service will begin at eight o'clock. Rev. Charles E. Cunningham will render the invocation; there will be a scripture reading by Rev. E. C. Bartlett. Former pastors will reminisce on the church of yesterday. There will be special music by the choir and vocal solos by Abram Maryott and by Mrs. L. H. Tooley. Rev. Fred Whitford will pronounce the benediction.

"[On Monday] Members of the Midland Ministerial Association will hold their Annual Meeting. Members of the Church will hold a business meeting at the church in the afternoon and there will be public services again at eight o'clock that evening. Urgent invitation has been issued by the Methodists to the people of this community to attend the various sessions. "


