August 2021 Notes from the Sky Pilot's Page Red Lodge, Montana

Climbing a hill is no easy task, especially when you haven't done it in 23 years. In 1998 I power-walked 8 miles a day, climbed hills without breaking a sweat and enjoyed the ability to take a hike on rough terrain without fearing that I would lose my footing. Over then next 2 decades I would not only stop power walking, I would also lose much of my agility due to weight gain, a suddenly sedentary life-style and then a knee injury. I am finally getting my footing back after 3 years of rehab, a more active lifestyle and healthy eating. However... it is still slow going on those hills.

Last week my neighbor and I took a very short hike up a very steep hill. We went along at a slow pace, and even at that pace I realized how out of shape and out of practice I really was. A body that I had taken for granted was none too pleased with my exuberant ambition. Burning muscles, heaving lungs and searing heat on my un-capped head quickly brought us back down that hill. And it was a very good reminder of two things: buy a cap, and stop assuming that what I did 20 years ago will quickly bounce back to normal without practice, training, and a plan.

I found myself in this exact situation with Vacation Bible School last week. As a nationally certified camp director I thought that I was prepared to assist with our "God in Nature" theme without having a fully prescribed plan in place. Oh was I wrong. Of course, VBS was a fabulous success for the children as we laughed, sang, hiked, painted, fed, conversed, played, collected and explored in nature. For me it was more of a 5 -day hike up one of the steepest grades I've been on in over 20 years, relying on muscle memory that was, well... very out of shape.

What I learned about myself, and our church, is that we need more practice and preparation. We need more practice runs on smaller hills before we take on a seemingly familiar mountain. Due to my over-exuberant ambition and clumsy assumptions, feelings were hurt, misinformation was shared, and hearts were damaged. I deeply apologize for all of that; we are only human and while grace abounds, it still hurts. If my ambition and assumptions have in anyway created pain in your life, be it from VBS or any other part of our church life together, I need you to help me find a way forward with you; and the only way that is possible is through direct conversation with me. Consider this our way of putting a cap on my sun-burned head. Help me to help you help our church.

Our Pastor Parish Relations Committee has embraced a covenant with me and our church that the only conversations that we can have are in a direct way with only the people involved. In other words, we cannot entertain gossip, hearsay or rumors. We follow the teaching of the Gospel of Matthew, the 18th chapter, "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses." (NRSV)

And so I ask two things of you: if someone starts a sentence with "I heard that..." please walk away from the conversation. And if I have hurt you, please come and see me. For where two are gathered, the Divine is in our midst, the Divine creator, healer and redeemer. Now... let's get back to our hiking up those hills... in preparation for the mountaineering that God has called us to do.

Ad-Hoc Restructuring Committee to make recommendations to the Church Council

The Ad-Hoc Restructuring Committee was formed some months ago to look at how we as the church might need to re-create our structure of leadership. We currently have a cumbersome design that requires 7 officers and we have only been able to fill 3 of those positions this year. It is also unclear in job descriptions and roles and responsibilities of the staff and pastor.

The Ad-Hoc Restructuring Committee consists of a representative from each of the Standing Committees, working with Pastor Pam in discovering the history and creation of the current leadership structure, and polling the committee members and other worshipers as to the reasons why they cannot fill the current leadership roles in the church. The committee also asked for suggestions on how to move forward in re-creating the leadership structure in such a way that the officers' positions could be filled.

The results of those conversations were shared, and the Ad-Hoc Committee is recommending that the Executive Council and Church Council be merged to include only 3 officers (as required by law), that those officer positions be copositions and that the Church Council be the recommending body to the congregation. The job descriptions for the 3 officers' positions (Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer) would be pared back from the current By-Laws and Standing Rules; staff would be paid to assume some of the officer's responsibilities, more Ad-Hoc Committees would be used for specific annual tasks, and the pastor's job description would clearly include the role of Executive Director.

The Ad-Hoc Restructuring Committee has recommended a series of "educational gatherings" to define the roles of the officers, the responsibilities of the staff, and the clarification of the job descriptions. Those gatherings would also lead to a streamlining of the By-Laws and Standing Rules, with the creation of a new Ad-Hoc Committee to recommend re-writes of the rules for congregational approval.

These recommendations will be presented to the full Church Council for their approval at the July 22 meeting. For clarifications and questions on this report, please contact Pastor Pam. 


can use the directory form on the website. If you have questions or issues email or call Janet at the church office. Enjoy!
