"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth...and God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness." Genesis 1: 1, 3-5

Come, live in the light! Jesus does not work in the darkness, rather Jesus works in the light. By opening the way to understanding, we open the way to light. There are many times in our lives when we find ourselves in a dark place. Illness, grief, aloneness, loneliness. Those are all times of darkness in our lives, and they are normal dark places in life. What is not normal, healthy darkness, is when we hold ourselves in darkness when God has called us to be the light of the world.

February can be a very dark month, even with all of the hearts and chocolates. The sun sets too early and rises too late. The cold causes us to bundle up, covering our bodies from the natural light of the sun when it is in the sky. As we continue to live into the darkness of the unknown future due to the pandemic, we must live in that darkness by exposing our faith to as much light in Christ that we possibly can. Do not, dear friends, hold yourselves in darkness. One of the most common places of darkness that we find ourselves bound to is in what I refer to as a "state of confusion." Confusion allows darkness to prevail, and it takes work to clear away confusion, allowing the light of Christ to shine through. Where do you find confusion in your life this February? And how can you open the way to letting the light in, resolving the unknown, finding answers and knowing when to set confusion off in its own dark corner, not allowing it to own you?

From the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus himself saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." We have Jesus as the one who sheds light on darkness, dispersing the confusion. We allow Jesus to do that by asking questions of curiosity and seeking clarity.

So live in the light! Share your light with the world however you can, for in sharing your light you are helping others overcome their darkness. And enjoy that chocolate because...it can't hurt!

### A Word from the Deacons....

The following message was sent to our congregation by your deacons. If you did not receive this information or would like assistance getting on the vaccine list, please call one of the deacons listed.

When vaccines arrive, Carbon County will begin offering Covid 19 vaccinations to persons included in **Montana's 1B Phase Group.** This initial phase targets those most at risk for severe Covid disease.

Generally, it includes anyone 70 years of age and older, people of color includ-

ing <a href="https://surveymonkey.com/r/C27SG8PNative">https://surveymonkey.com/r/C27SG8PNative</a> Americans and other at-risk groups ages 16-69 years of age with any of the nine listed high-risk medical conditions.

The vaccination process will look very different than receiving a flu shot. Limited supply arriving weekly will require you to be placed on a vaccine interest list. You will be notified via email or phone in the order you were placed on the list by our local Public Health Department.

Phase 1B is a large group and will take several weeks to complete and hopefully Montana will begin vaccinations in the next two weeks. You may be called sooner if vaccines are available.


check out the face lift. Here are a couple of snapshots of the room with new carpet and new paint.

- · Markers, paint or decorative tape


### What you do:


