From Psalm 139, "Where can I go from your spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast."

Council Meeting Minutes June 11, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Moderator, Debbie Awes. Pastor Pam opened with prayer. Those in attendance were Pastor Pam, Debbie Awes, Debbie Tomicich, Dixie McCampbell, Diny Gumper, Laurie Judd, Skip Bratton, and Renee Gabrian.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. Debbie Tomicich moved the minutes be approved as written, Skip seconded, and motion carried.

<u>Financial Secretary</u>: Debbie reported \$250.00 was donated by Humanities Montana for use of the PA system. \$4500.00 was given by an anonymous donor to meet the Hazel Chamberlain Endowment mission giving. \$575.00 has been received for Strengthen the Church. Debbie will correct accounting for open collection money income that has been assigned to pledges in error.

<u>Pastor</u>: Pastor Pam read her report for the past month and it is on file. It is with utmost joy that she accepted the call to remain in Red Lodge to become our "Settled Pastor." She presented her strategic plan with current practice, immediate future, and 5 year plans. She will not be going to the OWL training as the hope is the training will be available in MT. She also reported she is not attending Synod in June.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Laurie reported budget and payments are good.

<u>Moderator</u>: Debbie reported the special meeting June 9 went well with unanimous vote for Pastor Pam's call as Settled Pastor. She will be in contact with Marc Stewart for Pastor Pam's installation in August. Due to Tuesday meeting conflicts, monthly Council meetings will now be on the second Thursday at 5:15 PM.

<u>Diaconate</u>: Renee reported Martha Sobral has made a master list for greeters that will be passed around during services for people to approve or change their assigned dates. Report is on file.

<u>Facilities</u>: Skip informed us a linen rack and shelving are being constructed. They are working on stability issues with chairs in Upper Room, replacing lights with LED bulbs, making arrangements for snow removal, and will reschedule the outdoor work day that was cancelled due to weather. Skip and Jay West painted the banister. Skip was contacted for church use for a Memorial service for Patti and Jerry Nordstrom. There will be no kitchen use needed. Dixie moved we waive the church fee, Diny seconded, and the motion carried.

<u>Christian Education</u>: Pastor Pam informed us a Sunday playgroup with volunteers during worship will continue through the summer.

<u>Finance</u>: Dixie reported the budget is short \$9467.59. She has purchased the two approved CD's with Cornerstone at 3.15% interest. Dixie moved we accept the recommendation of Stewardship and Mission for Hazel Chamberlain Endowment disbursement, Debbie Tomicich seconded and the motion carried. Mark Schubert will be presenting a congregational training for mission giving.

<u>Stewardship and Mission</u>: Diny reported they have been focused on the Hazel Chamberlain mission. The Outreach Trip to the Northern Cheyenne Reservation has space for ten. Book donations are being received. The June 25th meeting will include looking into information from the National UCC for the pledge drive.

Old Business: None

<u>New Business</u>: Pastor Pam read her Letter of Call. Skip moved we accept the Letter of Call as it is written and that it be sent to Finance for final approval. Debbie Tomicich seconded the motion. Discussion was held and the motion carried.

The next meeting will be July 11, 2019 at 5:15 PM. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
