

Notes from the Sky Pilot's Page



March 2020

Lent...solemnity...sackcloth...ashes...dark...introspection...SPRING!!!...wait...what??!!

Isaiah 60:1 "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you!"

This year the Spring equinox happens to fall during Lent, which is not uncommon. The sun begins to shine brighter and longer. It returns to us at a time when we are supposed to be sitting in piles of ashes...or snow. So I've asked myself...and my colleagues...what if...just what if...we didn't do the solemnity "thing" for Lent but rather celebrated our creation instead. What if we celebrate the sun returning, and for the LOVE OF GOD...the snow melting??!! One of the blessings of being a congregational church is that WE get to decide the what, where, who, how and why of our worship...a.k.a Beatles love songs...and so this year Lent will be a little bit different.

Our focus Scripture will be readings from Isaiah 60, so you might want to study up on that. Our feature hymn for all 5 Sundays will be "For the Beauty of the Earth" and instead of a Prayer of Confession we will join in a Song of Confession. Oh...and communion? Yes, that is going to be a little bit different too. As we adorn our sanctuary with a beautiful painting that is being loaned to us by local artist Carol Hartman, we will be celebrating creation and our responsibility to the environment. The impetus for this is my Environmental Ethics course that I am taking this semester and an assignment to map my neighborhood through an ecotheological lens.

Will we still be able to be introspective? Of course we will. Will we still be able to think deeply of prayer, fasting and almsgiving? You betcha. Does this type of celebration for Lent mean that we are being irreverent? I am pretty sure that Jesus healed on the sabbath, talked to single women at the well and met with a tax collector in the dark; all of which were considered "irreverent" in that day. So no, we are not being irreverent, we are being honest about our identity. Last year for Lent we created a low-lit temple entrance and learned that we cannot sit still in solemnity for more than five minutes at a time. That simply is not our character. Just like it was not within Jesus' character to walk away from the sick, abandon women in public or ignore a whisper in the dark. Rather than deny our identity as outgoing, gregarious and welcoming people of God we are going to live into it and celebrate the season for which we can be most thankful, the season of creation.
