The meeting was called to order by Vice Moderator, Donna Ritter. Pastor Pam opened with prayer. Those in attendance were Pastor Pam, Donna Ritter, Debbie Tomicich, Skip Bratton, Dixie McCampbell, Renee Gabrian, and Dennis Brophy.

The minutes of the 6-11-19 meeting were reviewed. Debbie moved the minutes be approved as written, Skip seconded, and motion carried.

<u>Financial Secretary</u>: Debbie reported she has sent out the semi-annual pledge statements.

<u>Pastor</u>: Pastor Pam read her first official report as our settled pastor and report is on file. She will be on vacation July 18-26. Rev. David Munson will preach and we will host musician, Lynette Tedlund, at the piano for the July 21 service. Skip moved we pay the extra fee of \$250.00 for the special piano music, Debbie seconded, and the motion carried.

Pledge total received is \$73,620.13 of total \$116,550.00 pledged. Open collection total received is \$9687.92 of \$23,100.00 budgeted. Ann Winning has paid the first month rent for the Little Explorer Preschool.

Treasurer: Laurie reports budget and payments are good.

Pastor: Pastor Pam read her monthly report, and it is on file.

<u>Moderator</u>: Debbie reports she will be attending the Annual Conference Meeting to be held at Camp Mimanagish on 8-10-19. The Preschool Lease has been signed. She announced Renee Gabrian has resigned as Secretary, and Audrey Clark has agreed to replace her.

<u>Diaconate</u>: Renee reported Martha Sobral will be wintering in New Mexico after September and will no longer be lead Deacon. Other Deacon terms will be expiring 2019 as well. The Deacon closet contents were reviewed with all. Deacons will be sponsoring the picnic following service at Kaleva 8-11-19.

<u>Facilities</u>: Jay states volunteers have been mowing the church lawn. The committee has removed most props from the Preschool room, air conditioning has been repaired, the misplaced elevator documents have been located and inspection done, long term planning budget is in process, a microphone for meeting recording has been obtained, hearing devices are being researched, lighting has been replaced on front sign, and he will set up sound system for the Kaleva service.

The Pledge Drive Campaign will begin 9-8-19 and will end 10-13-19 with a stew cook off. The committee will increase pledge goal to \$182,000.00 to cover the cost of living increase. LuAnne Brown will be leaving the committee. Jay moved Julia Childs and Russ Lord be on the Stewardship and Mission Committee, Dixie seconded and motion carried. Jay moved Audrey Clark be Council Secretary, Linda seconded and motion carried.

Old Business: Pastor Pam would like to have our church open during the daytime. Discussion was held regarding church members volunteering to host hours at member discretion for a Chapel and Family Comfort Station. Jay moved RLCC host a Chapel and Family Comfort Station with members volunteering for hours hosted, Debbie Tomicich seconded and the motion carried. Pastor Pam will check with previous pastors regarding funding for stranded travelers which is not part of the Ministerial Funds.

<u>New Business</u>: Julia presented information on a workshop, Roots of Injustice, Seeds of Change Toward Right Relationship with Native Peoples presented by Rev. Duffy Peet and four trained leaders. Linda moved RLCC host this workshop 9-28-19 at 1:30 at the Sr Citizen Center, Laurie seconded and the motion carried. There will be a fee of \$250.00 which will be covered by a free will offering and Adult Education budget funds.

The next meeting will be 9-12-19 at 5:15 PM. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
